To View the Unicameral in Session

The following rules must be observed. Groups not meeting these requirements may be asked to leave.

1. Public seating is allowed in the balconies only. Groups may be escorted to the third floor viewing balconies by a tour guide or given permission to enter by a Sergeant-at-Arms (Red Coat). The tour guide or the Sergeant-at-Arms will fill out a form which will be presented to the presiding officer who will announce the group. Time permitting; please wait to be recognized by the body.

No seating is allowed in the bottom row of benches. Views are best from the upper balcony benches.

- 2. All briefcases, bags and purses are subject to search. No weapons are allowed.
- 3. **No flash photography**. Non-disruptive photography and videotaping is allowed without supplemental lighting.
- 4. Cellular phones and pagers must be turned off.
- 5. **No food, drink or smoking is allowed.** Shirts and shoes are required, please remove hats.
- 6. Everyone must remain seated and quiet while in the Legislative Chamber. No leaning on or over the balcony railing. Do not place or rest anything on the balcony railing. No talking, clapping, or gestures of approval or disapproval of the proceedings is allowed. Signs and placards are not allowed.
- 7. The entrance vestibule to the Norris Chamber is for senators to meet with individuals while the Legislature is in session.
